

BIOLOGY Terminology



Cell The smallest unit of life that can perform all the functions of life. Cells are the building blocks of all organisms. They are made of a variety of molecules, including water, proteins, lipids, and carbohydrates. Cells are surrounded by a cell membrane that controls what enters and leaves the cell. Inside the cell, there are various organelles that perform specific functions.
