EKG Anatomy



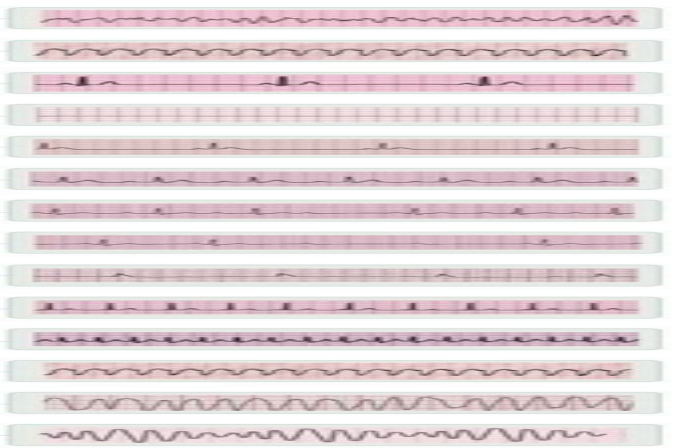
Wave - The electrical activity that occurs during the heart cycle. The P wave is the start of atrial depolarization, the QRS complex is ventricular depolarization, and the T wave is ventricular repolarization.

Interval - The time between two waves. The PR interval is the time between the P wave and the QRS complex, and the QT interval is the time between the start and end of the QRS complex.

Segment - The time between two intervals. The ST segment is the time between the end of the QRS complex and the start of the T wave.

EKG Rhythms

- Normal Sinus Rhythm** - Regular rhythm with a rate of 60-100 bpm, P waves before each QRS, and a PR interval of 0.12-0.20 seconds.
- Sinus Bradycardia** - Regular rhythm with a rate less than 60 bpm.
- Sinus Tachycardia** - Regular rhythm with a rate greater than 100 bpm.
- Sinus Arrest** - Absence of P waves for a short period of time.
- Sinus Exit Block** - Absence of P waves for a short period of time, followed by a normal P wave.
- First Degree AV Block** - Prolonged PR interval greater than 0.20 seconds.
- Second Degree AV Block Type I (Wenckebach)** - Progressive PR interval prolongation until a QRS complex is dropped.
- Second Degree AV Block Type II (Mobitz II)** - P waves are present but some QRS complexes are dropped.
- Third Degree AV Block** - P waves and QRS complexes are dissociated.
- Bundle Branch Block** - Abnormal QRS complex morphology.
- Left Bundle Branch Block** - Deep S waves in leads V1, V2, and V3.
- Right Bundle Branch Block** - M-shaped S waves in leads V1, V2, and V3.
- Bundle Branch Block with ST-T Changes** - ST segment depression and T wave inversion in leads with deep S waves.
- Accelerated Idioventricular Rhythm** - Regular rhythm with a rate of 60-100 bpm, no P waves, and a narrow QRS complex.
- Accelerated Junctional Rhythm** - Regular rhythm with a rate of 70-100 bpm, no P waves, and a narrow QRS complex.
- Accelerated Ventricular Rhythm** - Regular rhythm with a rate of 60-100 bpm, no P waves, and a wide QRS complex.
- Idioventricular Rhythm** - Regular rhythm with a rate of 40-60 bpm, no P waves, and a wide QRS complex.
- Ventricular Tachycardia** - Regular rhythm with a rate greater than 100 bpm, no P waves, and a wide QRS complex.
- Ventricular Fibrillation** - Irregular rhythm with no discernible QRS complexes.
- Asystole** - No electrical activity.

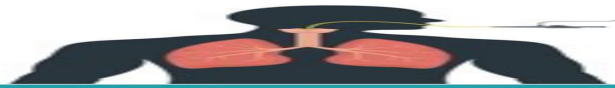


Electrical Therapy Basics



- Defibrillation** - The electrical shock that is used to stop a life-threatening arrhythmia.
- Synchronized Cardioversion** - The electrical shock that is used to stop a life-threatening arrhythmia.
- Transcutaneous Pacing** - The electrical shock that is used to pace the heart.

Airway Management



- Oral Airway** - Used for patients who are unconscious and have a patent airway.
- Nasopharyngeal Airway** - Used for patients who are unconscious and have a patent airway.
- Endotracheal Intubation** - Used for patients who are unconscious and have a patent airway.

Post-Resuscitation Care



- Follow the ABCs** - Airway, Breathing, Circulation, Disability, Exposure.
- Monitor** - Monitor vital signs and oxygen saturation.
- Fluids** - Administer fluids as ordered.
- Medications** - Administer medications as ordered.
- Transport** - Transport the patient to the hospital.

Acute Coronary Syndromes (ACS)

- Unstable Angina** - Chest pain that is not relieved by rest or nitroglycerin.
- ST Segment Elevation MI (STEMI)** - Chest pain with ST segment elevation on EKG.
- Non-ST Segment Elevation MI (NSTEMI)** - Chest pain with ST segment depression or T wave inversion on EKG.



Stroke Assessment and Treatment

- Recognize and Treat the Signs and Symptoms** - FAST: Face, Arm, Speech, Time.
- Administer Oxygen** - Administer oxygen as ordered.
- Administer Medications** - Administer medications as ordered.
- Transport** - Transport the patient to the hospital.

Code Termination

- Consult with Medical Director Before Code Termination** - Consult with the medical director before terminating a code.
- Recognize Signs of Death** - Recognize signs of death such as fixed, dilated pupils and no response to stimuli.
