- **Contrapposto:** weight on one leg and hip thrust to the side; used by the ancient Greeks, starting in the fifth century B.C.E. The pose was innovative because it moved away from the stiff and static look of earlier sculptures.
 - Examples:
- **Kore:** means "young woman" refers to an Archaic Greek statue of a standing young woman.
 - Examples:
- **Kouros:** means "young man" refers to an Archaic Greek statue of a standing young man.
 - Examples:
- **Daedalic Style:** a style characterized by a triangular face and flat heavy hair falling on either side of the face.
 - Examples:
- **Chryselephantine:** (of ancient Greek sculpture) overlaid with gold and ivory.
 - Examples:
- **Doric order:** set of rules for temple building characterized by a cushion-shaped column capital and a frieze consisting of metopes and triglyphs.
 - Examples:
- **Metope:** square panel.
 - Examples:
- **Barrel vault:** extension of an arch to form a tunnel.
 - Examples:
- **Forum:** public square of a Roman city; the religious, political, and commercial center of any Roman city was its forum.
 - Examples:
- **Spolia:** spoils; reuse of stone sculpture; refers to the reuse of building stone or decorative sculpture on a new monument.
 - Examples:
- **The Classical Orders:** Doric, Ionic, Corinthian
 - Diagram:
- **Verism (adjective veristic):** Roman portrait style characterized by being hyper-realistic; "true to life"
 - Examples:
- **Krater:** ancient Greek vessel used for diluting wine with water. It usually stood on a tripod in the dining room, where wine was mixed. Kraters were made of metal or pottery and were often painted or elaborately ornamented.
 - Examples:
- **Treasury:** building to store and display votive offerings.
 - Examples:
- **Cella or naos:** central room of a temple.
 - Examples:
- **Peristyle:** a row of columns surrounding the perimeter of building or a courtyard; A peristyle is a colonnade or row of columns surrounding a space such as a temple, courtyard, church, or cloister.
 - Examples:
- **Ionic order:** set of rules for temple building characterized by a volute scroll-shaped column capital and a continuous frieze.
 - Examples:
- **Corinthian capital:** the defining element of the Corinthian order is its elaborate, curved capital, featuring the stylized leaves of an acanthus plant.
 - Examples:
- **Caryatid:** column in the form of female statues.
 - Examples:
- **Atrium:** central room of a Roman house, partly open to the sky.
 - Examples:
- **Damnatio memoriae:** a term we use to describe a Roman phenomenon in which the government condemned the memory of a person who was seen as a tyrant, traitor, or other sort of enemy to the state.
