Criminalising Cartels Caron Beaton-Wells, Ariel Ezrachi, 2011-02-10 This book is inspired by the international movement towards the criminalisation of cartel conduct over the last decade Led by US enforcers criminalisation has been supported by a growing number of regulators and governments It derives its support from the simple yet forceful proposition that criminal sanctions particularly jail time are the most effective deterrent to such activity However criminalisation is much more complex than that basic proposition suggests There is complexity both in terms of the various forces that are driving and shaping the movement economic political and social and in the effects on the various actors involved in it government enforcement agencies the business community judiciary legal profession and general public Featuring contributions from authors who have been at the
